Assessment

1. Each exam will be marked up to **100 points**.
2. The number of questions varies by subject
3. For the MCQ exams there **may be** a special answer sheet, in which you must use **ONLY A PEN** for shading inside the bubbles. Also, you have to write your roll number, it may be **7 digits of your ID number**. It may be different according to the subject. So, please read the instructions carefully before starting the exam.

Exam rules

1. Every morning, please check your exam schedule and exam room:
 - a. Which exam you have
 - b. Room number, where you will have exam
2. Students should come to the exam room **20 minutes before** the exam.
3. Go to the toilet BEFORE the exam, because you are not allowed to go to the toilet during the exam except in extreme cases as health issues.
4. Students must be on time for the exams. If a student is **late for more than 15 mins**, he/she will **not be allowed** to attend the exam and will therefore get 0 marks for it. If a student is late, no extra time will be given. There are no retakes of exams.
5. Students should bring their **ID cards/Passport** with them. If a student forgets to bring the student ID card, they can visit AA and get a copy of the ID from LMS).
6. Students should leave all their unnecessary stuff (bags, books, TAB, notes, phones, laptops) outside or at the end of the room in the designated area.
7. Proctors will spread the exam sheet 5 minutes before the exam
8. Students are not allowed to open the test until the proctor allows it.
9. The exam should start at the exact appointed time.
10. Students are not allowed to use e-materials while taking an exam.
11. Desks should be free from unnecessary items, such as books, notes, technology, food, water, clothes.
12. If you have in your possession, or access to, any non-permitted items, whether or not they have been used, or were unintentionally or intentionally retained, it will be equal to cheating, hence you will automatically get 0 marks for the exam. Such items include but are not limited to: communication devices, including mobile phones, notepads, smartwatches, and any other technical or computing equipment capable of accessing the internet, email, and/or storing data including notes and photos.
13. The use of any other item (ex., calculator) is not allowed **unless** requested by subject-specific professors.
14. You must not communicate or attempt to communicate with anyone (except the invigilators) inside or outside the exam venue during the exam. If you do, you will get a warning for the first attempt, and 0 marks for the second attempt.
15. You must not copy or attempt to copy from another student's work. If you do, you will get 0 marks.
16. You must not cause a disturbance or disruption (including if your mobile phone

rings during an exam).

17. All containers, including pencil cases or boxes, spectacle cases or drinks containers must be transparent and should not contain any notes or other non-permitted materials.
18. No part of an answer book should be torn out and all answer books and other material supplied in the exam room should be left behind on your desk at the end of the exam. Please do not attempt to remove any answer books or question papers from the exam room.
19. The participant is not allowed to leave his/her seat during the exam without getting permission from the invigilator.
20. If students have any misunderstandings or questions, they should raise their hands, and proctors should assist them.
21. An infraction to any of these rules will result in either a warning or your test being taken away.
22. You are not allowed to leave the exam room **during the first 15 minutes** of the exam nor **the last 10 minutes** of the scheduled examination.

1	Academic & Communication Skills I	60	<p>Exam Format: Paper-based exam</p> <p>Instructions:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. You are given 60 minutes; 2. There is only 1 part: Writing a reflective essay. It is worth 50 points. 3. Additional materials are not allowed..
2	Calculus I	120	<p>Exam Format: Written + MCQs</p> <p>Instructions:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. You are given 120 minutes. 2. There are two parts (A & B) for final term exam. For part A there will be 25 MCQs, and 7 Long Questions for Part B. Each MCQs is worth 2 point and hence a total number of 50 points. And out of 7 long questions, 6 long questions are worth 42 points where each question will carry 7 points, and 1 long question is worth 8 points. 3. Additional materials are not allowed. 4. A scientific calculator is allowed.
3	History of Science in Uzbekistan	120	<p>Exam Format: Mixed (written+MCQ), open-ended and short answer questions</p> <p>Instructions:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. You are given 120 minutes; 2. There are 2 parts of the exam paper: 3. Part 1: MC Questions. There are 49 multiple choice questions in this section. 4. Part 2: Short answer questions: There are 1 short-answer questions in this section. 5. In total, you are required to answer 50 questions. Each question worths 2 points. 6. Additional materials are not allowed.

4	Computer Programming I	120	<p>Exam Format: Mixed (Written+MCQ)</p> <p>Instructions:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. You are given 120 minutes; 2. There are 4 sections of the exam paper: 3. Section 1: Multiple Choice Questions. There are 15 questions in this section. Every question is worth 1 point. 4. Section 2: Code Tracing. There are 5 questions in this section. Every question is worth 5 points. 5. Section 3: Spot the Bug / Fill in the Blank. There are 4 questions in this section. Every question is worth 5 points. 6. Section 4: Handwritten Coding. There are 3 questions in this section. Two questions are worth 10 points each, and one question is worth 20 points. 7. In total, you are required to answer 27 questions. 8. Additional materials and calculators are not allowed.
5	Physics I	120	<p>Exam Format: Mixed (written+MCQ), short answer questions, case studies, long answer question.</p> <p>Instructions:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. You are given 120 minutes; 2. There are 4 parts of the exam paper: 3. Part 1: MC Questions. There are 10 multiple choice questions in this section. Every question is worth 2 point. 4. Part 2: Short answer questions: There are 5 short answer questions in this section. Every question is worth 5 points. 5. Part 3: Case studies: There are 3 case studies in this section. Every question is worth 10 points. 6. Part 4: Long answer question. This question is worth 25 point. 7. A formula sheet is provided. 8. A scientific calculator is allowed.

6	Information Systems & Digital Technologies	120	<p>Exam Format: Mixed (MCQ), Short Answer Questions, Long Answer Questions</p> <p>Versions: A</p> <p>Instructions:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. You are given 120 minutes to complete the exam. 2. The exam paper consists of three parts: 3. Part 1: Multiple Choice Questions (MCQs). There are 50 multiple choice questions in this section. Each question is worth 1 point. (An answer sheet will be provided. Please mark your answers on the answer sheet using a blue pen.) 4. Part 2: Short Answer Questions. There are 10 short-answer questions in this section. Total marks for this part: 30 points (3 points each). 5. Part 3: Long Answer Questions. There are 3 long-answer questions in this section. Total marks for this part: 20 points. Each question is worth 6, or 8 points, depending on its difficulty level. 6. In total, you are required to answer 63 questions. 7. Additional materials are not allowed.
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
